In the summer vegetable garden, it is time to plant tomatoes for the fall harvest and your peppers and okra are actively growing and producing a crop. It is also not too early to think about the winter garden. The beds need to be planned and prepared for the major planting in September and October. For my money, the winter is the most pleasant time to garden in South and Central Texas. The winter garden can also be very productive. If you haven't ever done a winter vegetable garden or want to become more successful, here are several education opportunities to consider.

On Saturday August 3 the AgriLife Extension Service offers the Backyard Basics Expo at the Garden Center (3310 Funston) from 8:30 am-12:30 pm. The Expo will include classes and exhibits with repeat sessions so that attendees can attend all the programs on their favorite topics. In addition to classes on fall gardening, there will be programs on backyard chickens, fruit trees, pollinator gardening, beekeeping, drip irrigation, and composting. There will be lots of handouts, drawings, and topics to interest young people. The cost for the Expo is \$20 for adults and youth older than 11 if you register by August 1.
